 - Evaluate two-week baseline for an ED before adding to system
 - Evaluate usefulness of data source before prospective analysis (e.g. school absenteeism experience)
- ◆ Maintaining relationships with data providers: lessons learned.

- Give feedback to data providers
- Get feedback from data providers
- Be respectful of competing demands on staff
 - IT staff-asking for missing data
 - Hospital staff-calling or visiting an ED
